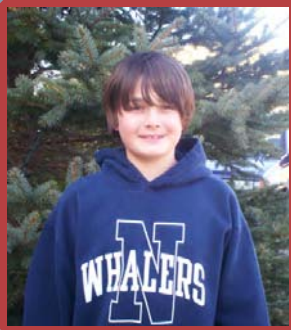




Landmarks OF NANTUCKET!
